INTRODUCTION

The Free Dental Camp was organized with the association of Germany NGO under the supervision of Dr. Agnes Wagner and coordination with Mr. Mohan Kumar Lama in Nepal. The aim of the organization is to provide the dental treatment to the people of remote areas and the poor people those who are unable to achieve the general treatment because of the poverty. Dr. Agnes showed the positive response to help the remote village with the request of Mohan Lama. Dr. Agnes has decided to help the village people with providing three volunteers. The village name is Dimi Pokharai VDC, Ramechhap District which is located in the eastern part from Kathmandu and mostly the people are illiterate and highly poor in economically. The place is beautifully surrounded by the Himalaya and the people are resided in the sloppy areas.

Dr. Anna, Marlene Borchert and Filia Sigmar the volunteer along with Mr. Mohan Kumar Lama and Enuka Tamang headed towards the Dimi Pokhari on August 23, 2016 morning and successfully organized the camp for 4 days and returned on August 28, 2016 in Kathmandu.



TRAVELLING KATHMANDU TO DIMI POKHARI

We had started to travel in the morning 10 AM from Kathmandu and reached at Murkot at 3 PM where we had our snacks. The way to the Manthali was quite good but after that the way was really unbelievable, it was all the way to top of the hill and road was quite narrow and very bumpy. We were so much scared throughout the way for several time because of road was muddy and sloppy because of land sliding. We were very much frightened and couldn't dare to stay in the jeep and walked for few minutes until the vehicle crossed the dangerous spot. Everywhere there was Himalaya in surroundings and finally at night at 7:15 PM reached in Dimi Pokhari where villagers are highly awaiting to welcome by offering us the scarves the tradition of Nepalese culture.

Some are graciously and innocently conveyed their painful teeth from the long time and no any alternative way besides bearing the pain but now after treatment in the camp has changed his life. Some elderly people teeth were really horrible which made them difficult to chew the food, but after treatment they don't have any word to express their happiness.

DIFFICULTIES OVERCOME

There is no electricity in the village but solar light was available however problem for charging the dental equipments. Thus, some alternatives charging facilities were managed although the electricity was unavailable. There was a problem for the communication by mobile because the tower was not working since seven days before and finally at the end of our camp, it was repaired. The LED light to show the patient was out of battery, thus torch light was adjusted.

FOOD AND ACCOMODATION

There were not many tea shops as well the hotel to stay, thus accommodation was arranged in Mohan's sister house although tent was brought for the alternatives. There were not any special food besides the typical Nepalese food Dal, Rice and also were served the noodles and potato fries for dinner to make the different taste. Furthermore, Chapatti with egg and teas were served for the breakfast. Volunteers were tasted with village homely made (Raksi) wine in the last day although the taste is completely different.

Farewell day


